1. WHEREAS, The General Presbytery adopted the recommendations of the Structural Working
2. Group during its August 5 \& 7, 2017 meeting, which includes Item \#4
3. recommending that, prior to a change in leadership for the position of assistant
4. general superintendent, there be a thorough review of said position by a committee
5. appointed by the general superintendent, to be comprised from the General
6. Presbytery; and
7. WHEREAS, The office of the assistant general superintendent is scheduled for election during
8. the 2019 General Council; and
9. WHEREAS, L. Alton Garrison, our sitting assistant general superintendent has made known his
10. intention to not seek re-election at the completion of his present term; and
11. WHEREAS, The creation of this impending vacancy for the seat of assistant general
12. superintendent is the scenario that activates the recommendation of the General
13. Presbytery; and
14. WHEREAS, The Executive Leadership Team and the entire Fellowship would be well-served
15. by a nonresident executive officer; therefore, be it
16. RESOLVED, That General Council Bylaws ARTICLE II. ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND

76. the responsibility of making careful investigation concerning the qualifications
77. and general fitness of available candidates for these offices and shall select by
78. secret ballot one or more names to be presented for each office to the General
79. Council in session for election. The General Presbytery shall submit as
80. nominees to the General Council all qualified candidates who have received at
81. least 10 percent of the votes cast by the General Presbytery. The candidates
82. shall be presented to and voted upon by secret ballot by the General Council in
83. session. In the event that only one candidate receives at least 10 percent of the
84. votes cast in the General Presbytery nomination, the vote distinction by the
85. General Council shall be by selecting "yes" or "no." There shall be no further
86. nominations from the General Council floor. A two-thirds vote of all votes cast
87. shall be required to elect. If no election has been declared after the third elective
88. ballot, the three candidates having the highest number of votes in the last ballot
89. cast shall be nominees to be further voted upon, and all other names shall be
90. eliminated.

93. b. Other officers. The assistant general superintendent, general secretary,
94. general treasurer, executive director of Assemblies of God World Missions, and
95. executive director of Assemblies of God U.S. Missions shall be elected in the
96. following manner: The General Presbytery, serving as a nominating committee,
97. shall be entrusted with the responsibility of making careful investigation
98. concerning the qualifications and general fitness of available candidates for
99. these offices and shall select by secret ballot one or more names to be presented
100. for each office to the General Council in session for election. The General
101. Presbytery shall submit as nominees to the General Council all qualified
102. candidates who have received at least 10 percent of the votes cast by the General
103. Presbytery. The candidates shall be presented to and voted upon by secret ballot
104. by the General Council in session. In the event that only one candidate receives
105. at least 10 percent of the votes cast in the General Presbytery nomination, the
106. vote distinction by the General Council shall be by selecting "yes" or "no."
107. There shall be no further nominations from the General Council floor. A two-
108. thirds vote of all votes cast shall be required to elect. If no election has been
109. declared after the third elective ballot, the three candidates having the highest
110. number of votes in the last ballot cast shall be nominees to be further voted
111. upon, and all other names shall be eliminated.
